Beyond applications, many Gentoo users consider these indispensable:

If I were setting up a modern Gentoo desktop today

My default stack would be:

- Desktop: Hyprland or KDE Plasma
- Browser: Firefox
- Terminal: Kitty
- Editor: Neovim
- File manager: Yazi and Dolphin
- Media: mpv
- Documents: Okular
- Passwords: KeePassXC
- System monitoring: btop and fastfetch
- Containers: Podman
- VM management: QEMU with virt-manager
- Gentoo tools: eix, gentoolkit, and ccache.

That combination provides a fast, modern, Wayland-native desktop while staying close to the Unix philosophy that many Gentoo users appreciate.
